

Chairman's Annual Report

2022-2023



Dear residents of Shavington-cum-Gresty,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the 2022-2023 Annual Report. As I mark the end of my fifth year as Chairman of Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council, I am filled with immense pride in our collective accomplishments over the past year.

This has been the most significant year for generations; we have seen the passing of our monarch, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and the proclamation and coronation of King Charles III.

This year, we also reached several significant milestones, including the successful launch of the #QueenBee initiative, the organization of our inaugural Christmas Festival, a recordhigh occupancy rate of Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall since its inception, and the commemoration of Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee.

These achievements would not have been attainable without the unwavering dedication of our employees, Councillors, community groups, and volunteers. Due to the momentous events of this year, there has also been a tremendous amount of cross collaboration between community groups which is always wonderful to see.

For those who have recently joined our Parish, I trust that you have integrated seamlessly into our community and relished the diverse array of events we have hosted.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to all members of the Parish Council, both current and past, for their commitment to our Parish. I also convey my best wishes to those who did not stand for re-election in their future pursuits.



Annual Remembrance Service

We have consistently facilitated a multitude of community events throughout the year, including our annual Remembrance service which now follows a well-rehearsed format. We iterate on the exact format each year and the live streaming of our service has remained in place since we first introduced it during the coronavirus pandemic to ensure members of the community are able to watch along from home should they wish to.

I would like to express my deepest appreciation to everyone who contributes to the event behind the scenes, including Woodnoth-cum-Shavington WI whose steadfast support to provide refreshments at parish events, including Remembrance, does not go unnoticed.

Queen Elizabeth II and King Charles III

Shavington-cum-Gresty marked the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II in 2022 with a splendid array of events led by community groups including Shavington Village Festival Committee.

The celebrations included a concert honouring her remarkable seven-decade reign, our

annual village festival, and a joint outdoor church service.

Our Parish was among over 3,000 locations across the UK and Commonwealth to light beacons in tribute to this momentous occasion, and it was an honour to be asked to light ours alongside the esteemed President of Shavington Village Festival Committee, Councillor Rene Hancock.

The passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in September 2022 was indeed a solemn moment for us all. Nevertheless, we continue to cherish her unwavering dedication to our nation. Our Parish Council had been diligently preparing for her passing, ensuring that the necessary formalities were carried out seamlessly.



In September 2022, our Parish witnessed yet another historic event as we celebrated the accession of King Charles III to the throne. We honoured the occasion with the reading of the Proclamation outside Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall on Sunday, September 11th. It was heart-warming to see community members gather to recognize this solemn but momentous event.

The change of a monarch is a difficult time for all, and I would like to publicly thank Simona Garnero, Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council's Clerk, and Sara Randle, Shavington-cum-Gresty Community Manager, along with Reverend Rachael Griffiths of St Mark's Church and Reverend Sarah Butcher from Shavington Methodist Church, for their commitment to ensuring the necessary preparations were in place in the months and years precedingthe event.



Thank you also to the members of the community who, following the announcement of the passing of Queen Elizabeth II, offered their support to ensure the pre-prepared letters were folded and assigned into delivery routes into the early hours of the morning, so that volunteers could spread the word across the whole Parish as soon as practicably possible.

We had just one chance to get this right and the hard work of all involved, including Council employees, to prepare in advance of the announcement, ensured we could execute seamlessly.

#QueenBee

This year, we successfully launched the #QueenBee initiative, which sought to both

celebrate the Platinum Jubilee and foster conservation efforts within the Shavington-cum-Gresty community.



The initiative encompassed a wide range of activities and events, such as flowerbed and wildflower planting, collaborative celebration gardens, #QueenBee trails, creative workshops, sunflower growing, and art competitions. The #QueenBee trail signs can still be seen on Cherry Tree Park.

Christmas Festival

In December 2022, we proudly hosted our very first Christmas Festival, which took place across the three sites of St Mark's Church, Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall, and Shavington Methodist Church.



The event featured Santa's Grotto, exquisitely decorated by Shavington Village Festival Committee, as well as stalls, fairground rides, music, a puppet show, hot churros from Hickory's Smokehouse, craft activities, and a Carol Concert by Audley Brass.

The festival experienced tremendous attendance, and whilst there is always room for improvement, it was a delight to witness our community unite in celebration of the festive season.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall

This year, I am proud to announce that we achieved the highest occupancy rate for Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall since its opening, thanks in part to a comprehensive overhaul of the booking process and commercial model which took place a few years ago that has contributed to a steady increase in usage since.

You will need strong shoes and gardening gloves if you have them, otherwise disposable gloves will be provided.

I can't attend on Saturdays so what can I do to help?

We ask that residents, please, continue to keep our Parish clean and tidy by cutting back overgrown trees and hedges which obstruct the pavement and try to keep the front of your property weed free.

We encourage residents to, safely, pick up any litter dropped outside their property and help to make our Parish a cleaner place.

We hope that this will become a regular event as Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council alongside community groups and organisations work together to make our Parish a great place to live.









A message from your PCSO

The work of the PCSO varies on a shift by shift basis. The community engagement work undertaken has included visiting local shops checking closed premises and unoccupied buildings on Crewe Road and Main Road. The PCSO has met with Motherwell and continued to check on vulnerable residents.

To continue his engagement with young people, the PCSO has also visited the local primary school to discuss the impact of Anti social behaviour after reports of some low level disruption at local park areas.

Tru-cam, the hand-held laser that is able to measure time and distance between vehicles and is used to identify speeding vehicles is undertaken on a regular basis by the PCSO alongside the community speed watch program when members of the community can assist with deterring speeding motorists.

This report is a general overview of what we have been doing these months and gives crime prevention advice.



Dedication of Rose Garden

The rose gardens, on the corner of Main Road and Barons Road were originally planted in 1977 to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II, signifying her twenty-five years on the throne. This planting was organised by Shavinqton Village Festival Committee in conjunction with Shavinqton-cum-Gresty Parish Council and local community groups and organisations.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council meeting minutes from 1 March 1977 document the Jubilee celebration plans.





The Secretary of the Jubilee committee, asked for 'support by approving Commemorative Rose Beds at the corner of Barons and Main Road' the minutes go on to explain that 'The planning, preparation and maintenance was promised by Shavinqton School and will usefully involve the 11-16 year olds.' It is reported that 'The council gave the project its blessing and approved the scheme'

An extract from the programme of events for the Festival Day:-

"12.30 Commemoration of the rose beds, Service to be conducted on the site at the corner of Barons Road end Main Road by the Village Clergy, with Hymns accompanied by the Crewe Co-op Youth Band."

For Queen Elizabeth's II's Golden Jubilee in 2002, the Festival Committee donated money to Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council to change the roses to those gold in colour.



Following these historical Parish events, Shavington- cum-Gresty Parish Council decided that it would be a fitting tribute to commemorate the Accession to the throne and Coronation of King Charles III through the dedication of a commemorative stone and the addition of new roses to the gardens.

The service was opened by Benjamin Gibbs, Chair of Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council and Rachael Nicholls Headteacher at Shavington Primary School. Eleanor Anderson, President of the WI, spoke about the importance of community. Rev Rachael Griffiths, Vicar at St Mark's Church and Averil George from Shavington Methodist Church led the prayers and a reading. After the dedication Rene Hancock, President of

Shavington Village Festival Committee, led the community to sing the National Anthem. Refreshments were served by Woodnoth-cum-Shavington WI in Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall after the service.

It was a well-attended celebration with almost one hundred Community members joining together for this historic occasion.

Allotment Tips

Hopefully the frosty nights have left us now and the brighter days and warmer nights are well underway. Hoe the ground to loosen the soil and remove the weeds and if there is limited rain, water regularly.

Check your to do list:

Harvest Beetroot, broad beans, cabbage, cauliflower, early peas, lettuce, rhubarb, spring onions, radish and spinach which can all start to be harvested now.

- Continually hoe the garden to remove weeds and break-up the soil. This will allow water to soak down into the earth.
- · Now is the time to put in supports for your peas and climbing plants.
- · Keep an eye on seedlings and thin them out when necessary.
- Keep an eye on watering flower beds. Do not allow plants under glass to dry out or overheat.
