

This year we will include a small parade before the service starts. The procession will include any Uniformed Services, Scouts, Beavers, Cubs and Brownies, Armed Forces Veterans, members of community groups and organisations laying wreaths and Council representatives.

Anyone wishing to join the parade should assemble at the Scout Hut at **10:15am**.

The parade will leave from the Scout Hut on Main Road at **10:30am** and will walk along Main Road to reassemble outside Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall ready for the start of the service at **10:40am**.

10.40am - A welcome from Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council.

A representative from Shavington Methodist Church will commence the service.

We meet in the presence of God.

We meet to remember with thanksgiving and sorrow those whose lives, in wars and conflicts past and present, have been given and taken away.

We meet to pray for all who in bereavement, disability and pain continue to suffer the consequences of fighting and terror.

We meet to commit ourselves to work in penitence and faith for reconciliation between the nations that all people may, together, live in freedom, justice and peace.
