Parish Council Meeting Reports



The Parish Council regularly meets each month to discuss matters of importance in the parish. Under delegated power, the committees meet to receive and consider updates and requests that fall under their jurisdiction. They focus on the specific actions in the terms of reference for each of the committees.

An update from each of the committees is summarised below.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council

- Strategic Review: Shavington-cum-Gresty
 Parish Council has committed to a strategic
 review to guide their activities over the next
 5 years. This review will be shared with
 residents to gather their valuable feedback.
- New PCSO: After over a decade of service, PCSO Pete Corbett has left the parish to progress in his career. The Parish Council warmly welcomes PCSO Dan Walley as the new addition to our community.
- Collaboration with Shavington Primary School: Simona Garnero, Clerk to Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council, had a positive meeting with the new Headteacher at Shavington Primary School. Both organisations are enthusiastic about working together.
- Main Road Car Park: The Clerk is awaiting a quote and a draft contract for the community use of the car park from the Finance Director and Estate and Marketing Director at The Learning Partnership. The goal is to have these by 1st November for consideration by Councillors before the 2024/25 budget is finalized.
- Budget 2024/25: The Parish Council is actively engaged in setting the budget for 2024/25, with approval expected in December.
- New Notice Board: A new notice board has been generously donated by Persimmon Homes and has been installed on Newcastle Road by the pedestrian crossing.
- Weston Ecological Mitigation Area: The Parish Council is exploring the acquisition of the Weston Ecological Mitigation Area behind Hickory's Smokehouse.

- Impact Project: The Parish Council has received £10,000 from The National Lottery Community Fund for the Impact project. This initiative aims to transform two phone kiosks into vertical gardens and create pollinator-friendly areas in the Parish. Work has already commenced in green areas outside Hickory's Smokehouse, Gresty.
- Local Council Award Scheme: The Parish Council submitted the portfolio for the Foundation Award at the Local Council Award Scheme. The award is aimed to certify the good governance of councils around the UK.

Community Engagement Committee

- Remembrance Service: The Remembrance Service took place on Sunday 12 November. Booklets were distributed to residents.
- Christmas Carol: Join us for the Christmas Carol event on Saturday, 23rd December.
- Christmas Event: The Parish Council has decided to cancel its Christmas event to support a community fundraising event organised by the Elephant pub. The funds raised at the Elephant event will go towards purchasing a much-needed defibrillator available for the whole community.

Planning Committee

Environment & Recreation Committee

- Gresty Lane Allotments: All plots have now been assigned. If you're interested in being added to the waiting list, please contact the Clerk Simona Garnero at clerk@shavingtononline.co.uk
- Shavington Park Allotment: Discussions are ongoing between Persimmon Homes and Trust Green to complete the transfer of the allotment site. The Parish Council is eager to expedite this process to grant access to those on the waiting list.





Parish Council Cancels Christmas Event to Support Community Defibrillator Initiative

On 4 October 2023, Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council made the decision to cancel its Community Christmas event on Sunday, 3 December, in favour of supporting another community initiative in the village.

The Elephant Public House, this event includes a Santa's Grotto, Christmas market, hog roast and children's entertainment. The primary aim of raising funds is for the acquisition of a defibrillator for use in the community. The availability of such a vital tool is crucial for the wellbeing of the community, ensuring that emergency services have access to essential resources needed to save lives.

Councillor B Gibbs, the Chair of the Parish Council, spoke on behalf of the council and emphasized that the decision was reached after careful consideration of all available options. The commitment of the council to support all community activities and events in the Parish ultimately led to the decision to step back from their own event and wholeheartedly support this remarkable initiative.

Councillor Benjamin Gibbs stated, "Having a defibrillator available in this location for the whole community will be a great asset and will ensure that, in an emergency, we all have access to the tools needed for rapid response and care."

Though the community Christmas event has been cancelled, **Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council is delighted to announce** that they will still be hosting a Christmas Carol event on Saturday, 23 December at 4PM. This cheerful occasion promises to bring warmth and festive cheer to residents as they celebrate the festive season and all are warmly invited to participate.

We have welcomed PCSO Dan Walley as our dedicated PCSO for Shavington-cum-Gresty.


Hello Shavington-cum-Gresty.

IMPRICT & COMMUNITY FUND



Following the success of the #QueenBee community project run by the Parish Council in 2022 and conscious of the community appetite to improve and enhance green spaces in the parish, Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council has successfully secured National Lottery Community funding of £10,000 for our new project 'IMPACT - every leaf counts'.

With 'IMPACT - every leaf counts', the Parish Council aims to create and enhance the biodiversity in the area with an emphasis on improving pollinator habitats, and to raise awareness and empower residents with taking ownership of green spaces in the parish.



The project aims to:

- Leaf 1: Revamp existing green spaces with pollinator-friendly plants.
- Leaf 2: Convert disused phone kiosks into community vertical herb gardens.
- · Leaf 3: Establish a group of volunteers to look after green areas in the parish.
- Leaf 4: Cultivate environmental awareness with a series of garden coffee meetings.
- Leaf 5: Promote opportunities for people to meet and connect with others who share similar interests or values, to help build social networks and strengthen relationships within the community.

The Parish Council will support community groups to work together to deliver/arrange/ present educational talks and workshops on environmental issues that directly affect the parish.

The Parish Council will help these community groups to promote these opportunities within the local community and encourage new membership.

The purpose of this is to create an awareness of the environmental support that people attending these groups can assist with on a local level. They will also create opportunities for people to meet and connect with others who share similar interests or values. It is hoped that this signposting will help build social networks and strengthen existing relationships within the community. This can help to reduce social isolation and create support for those facing challenges or difficulties. Helping to build a sense of community which can help enhance personal growth and well-being.

The focus of Leaf 1 was to revamp green areas in the parish across three different locations. The gardens will be planted with a selection of roses and bulbs, which are an important wildlife habitat and source of pollen for bees, butterflies and birds.

to be undertaken. These flower beds had become severely overgrown and then, after being cut back, were left unattended. Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council wanted to improve this focal point for residents and sought permission to reinstate these flowerbeds.

We were grateful for the support from Keltbray as they dedicated two of their community volunteer days to the project. The team worked so hard, working through a very wet first day! Staff from Hickory's Smokehouse Gresty also supported the project providing refreshments and involving themselves in the planting sessions. The Cheshire Wildlife Trust kindly provided us with advice and ideas for planting as we tried to select plants that would encourage wildlife habitat and provide sources of pollen for bees, butterflies, and birds.

The supplier for refurbishing the kiosks has been selected and refurbishment to convert them into Community Herb Gardens will start early in 2024.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council, St Mark's Church and Shavington Methodist Church, came together to lead our annual Parish Remembrance Sunday service on 12 November 2023.

The outdoor service at the war memorial was attended by a large crowd, whilst those who preferred to watch from home could do this through our live streaming of the event.

The service itself was opened by the Chairman of the Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council, Councillor Benjamin Gibbs, who introduced the first hymn. Rev. Sarah Butcher from Shavington Methodist Church and Rev. Rachael Griffiths from St Mark's then continued to lead following the hymn and introduced representatives from a variety of village organisations to contribute to the service:

- Scout leaders Chris Wood and Jen Wilkinson led the parade of Veterans. Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Brownies, Guides and community members
- · Cllr Rene Hancock from Shavington Village Festival Committee led the hymns
- · Shavington Ward Councillor Linda Buchanan read the poem 'Flander Fields'

- Amy Brock, Deputy Headteacher from Shavington Primary School, read the poem 'The Inquisitive Mind of a Child'
- · The Brownies, Scouts, Cubs and Beavers were also in attendance
- · David Bridge, a Royal Navy Veteran who served on HMS Shavington attended on behalf of the Ton Class Association

John Clark from Shavington Academy played the last post and a two-minutes' silence was held. Wreaths were laid by village organisations, and the village joined together in singing the National Anthem.

The live streaming of the service was very popular, and many viewers tuned in to see the service live or watch it afterwards.

HISTORICAL SHAVINGTON-CUM-GRESTY

This edition of our newsletter continues our 'Historical Shavington-cum-Gresty' Series, in which we would like

to share the history of Shavington-cum-Gresty with the parish.

In this edition and the next few editions of the newsletter we will feature some extracts and information from the booklet '100 Years of Education in Shavington' by L.A Barnett.

This centenary booklet was written to celebrate 100 years of education in Shavington from 1875 to 1975. Mr Barnett was Headteacher of Shavington Primary school.





The Early Years

In the next edition we will focus on the chapter the 'Middle Years of Education in Shavington'.

During the period from 1920 to 1950, the decades covering a general strike, depression, the silver jubilee of King George V shortly followed by his death; the accession of Edward VIII followed by his abdication, the accession and coronation of King George VI and, in the last decade, World War II, education continued in Shavington.

The Infant School, throughout the whole of this had one head teacher, Miss A Hallam, whose loyal service to county and the village was acknowledged at a retiring presentation on the 31st of January 1952.

The mixed school had three head teachers during this time. Mr W.L Plant who, after serving five years as head teacher, died following a very short illness of Pneumonia in 1922; Mr J.B. Ruscoe who, after eight years service in Shavington, proceeded to Haslington Council School as headteacher; and Mr R Dodd who retired in February 1951 after 20 years as head teacher of the school.

The school logbooks contained information about leaking roofs, missing coping stones, burst pipes and flooded Cellars. In 1926, the records refer to shortages of coke (a fuel derived from coal) during the National Coal Strikes and, on several occasions, children had to be sent home because school was not warm enough for them to stay. Mr Plant started parents visits to the school which continued as the feature of the school into the present day. The school was inspected once during Mr Plant's five years, and he received an excellent school report.



Mr Dodd became the headmaster of the Shavington Mixed School on the 13th of April 1931 and two changes in the school took place very soon after. The old, long seated wooden desk was slowly taken from the school and replaced with jewel desks. The second change took place in August 1931 when the old oil lamps were eventually taken down and electric lights came into the school. Efforts were made during this time to have the school equipped with some kind of hot water system, but it was not until 20 years later that the efforts bore fruit. In the 1930's, the death of King George V was followed by the coronation of King George VI in 1936 and all the school children received a commemorative Coronation mug.

1939 saw the outbreak of World War II. This time Shavington was host to a number of Liverpool evacuees, and the school was kept very busy at that time helping in the finding of homes for the children and in organising their education. Evacuee children were absorbed into the teaching life of the Shavington schools. Their own teachers came

with them and considerable reorganisation was necessary to provide them with accommodation. Sometime during this, four large air raid shelters were built in the field across the road from the school which is now the current Primary School playing field. During this period, the field beyond this was used as an allotment and many householders grew vegetables there.

It was in 1944 that the Education Act was passed. Education authorities were now providing secondary education for all children after their 11th birthday. Previously children with academic ability had been recommended by their head teachers to take either the scholarship examination or the fee payers' examination for entrance to grammar school. Children not taking these examinations stayed on at the Council school until they reached the age of 14 when they left. Under this new act, all the children were to receive a Secondary Education. They followed some sort of selection procedure, and in 1945 the examination selection took place. The school was closed on these occasions.

and only the children in the 10 plus age group attended. They took three papers, all taking approximately 45 minutes, in English, Arithmetic and Intelligence. In the late 40s discussions were taking place at County Hall concerning the provision of the secondary education in Shavington, but it was not until 1958 that the Shavington Secondary Modern School in Rope Lane was finally opened. In 1944, the Act also charged authorities with providing a school meal service in school. In Shavington, the first county meal service was

provided, and all meals were brought from a centre in Nantwich and served in St Mark's Church Hall. In 1950, the school canteen was opened, and meals were cooked in Shavington and served in the dining room.

There was one sad period during a time when Mr Dodd was headmaster. In November 1949 the school was closed because of an epidemic of poliomyelitis when several children caught the disease and one boy died.

For our next edition we will be covering the years 1950-1972. These are the final years before the Old School ceased to have pupils and Shavington County Junior School opened.

The walk took just over an hour and took the group on a circular route across the fields and along Main Road and Rope Lane.






Join Us for Our Winter Walk Sunday 21st January 2024

Scouts $^{\bigcirc}$

Spotlight on... Scouting

Our Shavington Scout Group boasts a rich history, with roots going back to the early 1900s. Not long after Robert Baden-Powell started the Scouting movement, young boys from Shavington, Willaston, and Wistaston formed part of a Scout Group in the Crewe District.

Officially, the 1st Shavington Scout Group began with registration in 1928. Records of early Scouting continuing are sparse, but we have details of activities until around 1937, and the current HQ was acquired in 1944. After a brief period of inactivity, Scouting resumed in Shavington, and since 1968, our village has had a consistent Scout Group presence.



By the early 1990s, Beavers were introduced, allowing younger kids to join in the fun, and a notable point, since 1991, Scouting in Shavington (and nationally), hasn't been just for boys. Our sections proudly include both girls and boys, reflecting the inclusive spirit of modern Scouting.

Cubs have been crate stacking, had a visit from the PCSO, enjoyed outdoor cooking, and hiking. The Scouts? They've been out sailing, exploring trails around Chester, golfing, climbing, trying archery, cooking in forest pizza ovens, and learning essential life skills.

We are hugely fortunate to have Milldale, our fantastic District campsite, nearby and many memories have been made and continue to be made at this wonderful place.

One testament to the popularity of Scouting in Shavington is the fact that we are always full and always with a sizeable waiting list. The small size of our Scout Hut means that the number of children that we can accommodate is always limited, but another limiting factor is getting adults that are willing to help out.


