They have visited to risk assess and have said they have a few members who they would like to take along.

**Proposal**

The Community Manager has met with representatives from each of the schools to discuss if there would be elements to fit in with the curriculum.

Ideas suggested from the meetings.

Shavington Primary children to have a 'local' history /identity project in the Year 2 Scheme of Learning. This would focus on a timeline of Shavington-cum-Gresty and would highlight to them key areas of interest. This would help to reinforce their identity and focus of belonging.

Shavington Academy students would look at their identity with a focus on their school logo and why they would identify themselves within the community in their SPARK lessons.

Shavington Academy is starting a GCSE Citizenship qualification and would be keen to see/ experience how local government work. Suggested link for students to attend a Parish Council Meeting. Further extension of this would be to support students to run a 'mock' meeting based on a 'mock' Parish Council agenda.

Both schools have been introduced to the Young Person Grant Scheme by the Community Manager and are keen to work with the Community Manager to apply.

Permission is sought to continue to investigate and develop ideas based on the suggestions above, and if acceptable for the Parish Council and Schools develop a delivery plan for the above.
