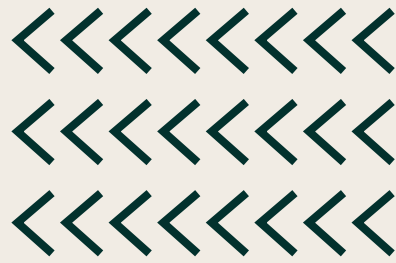

Parish Council Meeting Reports



The Parish Council regularly meets each month to discuss matters of importance in the parish. Under delegated power, the committees meet to receive and consider updates and requests that fall under their jurisdiction. They focus on the specific actions in the terms of reference for each of the committees.

An update from each of the committees is summarised below.

Community Engagement Committee

- **Wellbeing Wednesday:** The Parish Council received £5,000 from the Cheshire East Flourish fund for Wednesday activities:
 - Free cardio sessions at the Village Hall every Wednesday morning.
 - Community event at the Village Hall every third Wednesday.

- **D-Day Program:** The Parish Council was awarded £3,900 to celebrate the 80th anniversary of D-Day:
 - Two-day exhibition.
 - Workshops with local schools.
 - Interview with a D-Day veteran.
 - Distribution of a commemorative booklet.
 - Beacon lighting attended by over 300 residents.

- **Shavington Village Festival:** The Parish Council's stall featured activities, surveys, and free plants, making the event a great success.
- **Newsletter:** The September newsletter has been distributed, and the December edition is in progress.
- **Remembrance Service and Christmas Carols:** Planning for these events is underway.
- **Grant Scheme:** The revised Grant Scheme was approved and is now open for applications. Details can be found at shavingtononline.co.uk/app/uploads/2024/07/ScG-Grant-Program.pdf

Planning Committee

- The committee meets monthly to comment on planning applications. See pages 12/13 for information.

Environment & Recreation Committee

- **Green Spaces:** A gardener has been appointed to maintain the council's green spaces for the next 12 months.
- **IMPACT - Every Leaf Counts:** The £10,000 National Lottery-funded program has concluded:
 - Refurbishment of two disused BT kiosks into community vertical herb gardens.
 - Series of events and community garden coffee sessions.
 - Renovation of two flower gardens.
 - Establishment of a Watering Team.

Village Hall Committee

- **Occupancy:** The Village Hall's occupancy data for 2023/24 shows a total income of £19,191 with a 73% occupancy rate.
- **Window Blinds:** The council received a grant of £750 from the Cheshire East Improved, Greener, Community Facilities Fund for new blinds, with installation planned for Autumn.
- **Access Program:** A trial Village Hall Community Access Program will allow free Sunday afternoon bookings for local groups from September 2024 to March 2025. For more information, contact clerk@shavingtononline.co.uk

Finance & Strategy Committee

- The committee is reviewing and updating the Parish Council's policies and procedures.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council

- **Parish Council Strategy:** The Council approved the Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council Strategy 2024-2029 and the Delivery Plan 2024-25 following public consultation.
- **Ecological Mitigation Area:** A legal firm has been appointed to progress with the acquisition of the Western Ecological Mitigation Area. The land is between Crewe Road and the Taylor Wimpey housing estate, off Jack Mills Way.
- **Primary School Car Park:** The Council has agreed to a final draft of the agreement with Shavington Primary School for community use of the school car park on Main Road.
- **Village Hall Outbuilding:** A legal firm has been instructed to draft a lease with the Shavington Village Festival Committee for the free use of the Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall outbuilding.

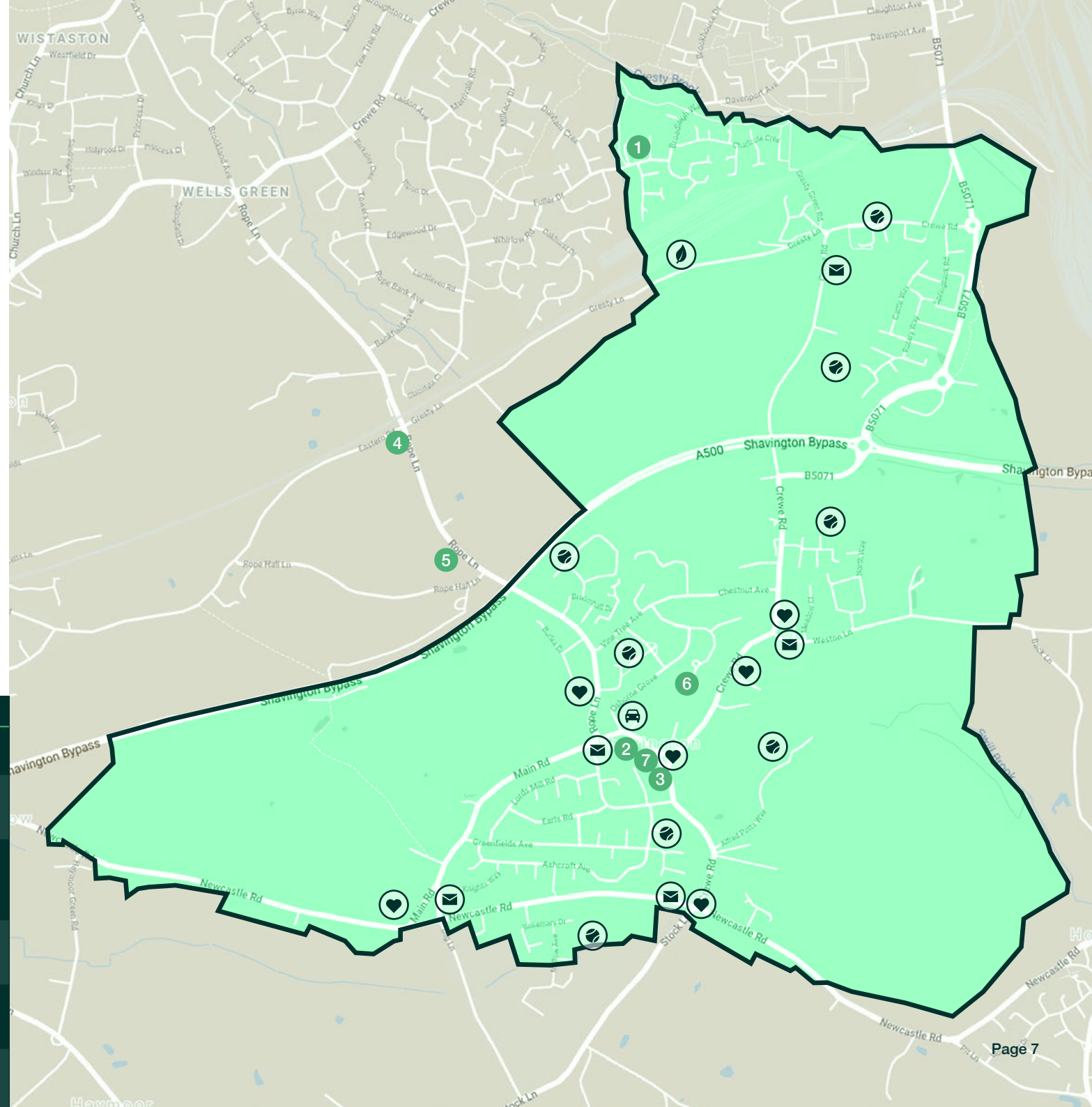

The next dates for the Clean Team to meet are: 21 September / 26 October

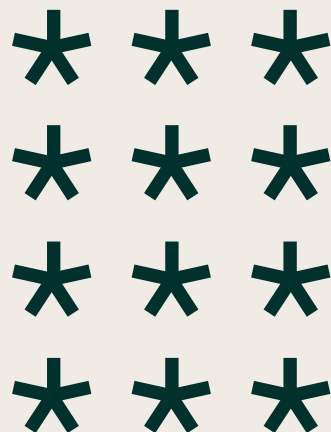
Who can join the Clean Team?

We encourage residents to, safely, pick up any litter dropped outside their property and help to make our Parish a cleaner place.

Types of Grants Available

1. Micro Grants: Up to £250

Perfect for individuals or informal groups, Micro Grants are available for small-scale projects that make a big impact. Your project must benefit the residents of Shavington-cum-Gresty and fit into one of our strategic themes:

- Building a United Community
- Protecting Our Environment
- Celebrating Our Heritage
- Improving Health and Wellbeing

Eligibility:

- Individuals or informal groups of residents
- Projects that directly benefit the Shavington-cum-Gresty community

2. Community Grants: Up to £1,000

Ideal for larger projects or established organisations, Community Grants can significantly enhance your initiatives. Match funding is preferred but not essential. Projects must demonstrate a clear benefit to the community and align with our strategic objectives.

Eligibility:

- Shavington-cum-Gresty based charities
- Organisations serving local residents
- Clubs, associations, or organisations within the community

3. Young Person Scheme: Up to £250

Empowering the next generation, this grant supports projects led by young residents or students. Projects should align with the strategic themes and benefit local schools or the wider community.

Eligibility:

- Students from Shavington Primary School or Shavington Academy
- Residents under 18

Application & Decision Process

Applying for a grant is simple! Complete the relevant application form available on our website. The decision-making process is designed to be quick and straightforward, with responses typically provided within one month.

Monitoring and Evaluation: We keep it light-touch! We require a brief summary of your project's outcomes, a few photos if appropriate, and quotes from beneficiaries. Successful projects will be featured in our Community & Engagement Committee updates.

Description: Advertisement Consent for Four advertising signs placed at entrance points on to roundabout.
Outcome: No comments.

Address: 3 Main Road, Shavington, CW2 5DY
Description: Erection of a log cabin type building for the purpose of running a small children's day nursery.
Outcome:

- Some of the submitted site plans and documents are outdated and inaccurate.
- There is insufficient provision of car parking spaces for both staff and customers.
- Issues related to access and vehicle movements have not been adequately addressed.

July 2024

Number: 24/2098N
Address: Land Adjacent to 16, Huntersfield, Shavington
Description: Variation of condition 2 on approval 21/0653N: It has been established that there are discrepancies between the ordnance survey mapping, on which the approved site layout plan is based, and our high level topographical survey. This has resulted in the site width (across plots 3 and 4) being approximately 1m less than approved. In order for the dwellings to fit within the site, we are proposing that the separation distance to the adjacent dwelling is reduced from 13.5m to 12.5m. This remains compliant with window to gable guidelines.
Outcome: The planning application is objected to on the grounds of overdevelopment, as there is insufficient room for additional property. Furthermore, the requested reduction in separation distance is considered unacceptable.

Questions have been raised regarding the reasons behind this concession being approved initially, and the parish council expects an explanation from the planning officer who granted this concession.

Description: Proposed two-storey side/rear extension to replace existing attached garage and to provide additional living accommodation, plus both internal and external alterations.
Outcome: No comments.

10 November 2024

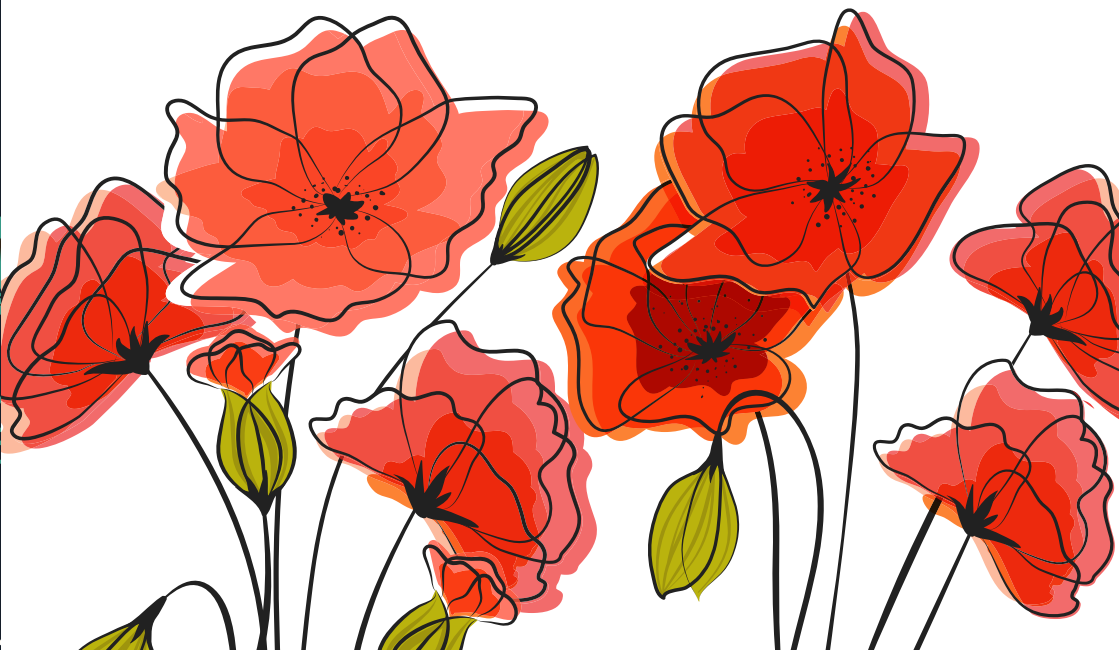
Remembrance Sunday, which this year falls on 10 November, is a day for the whole nation to remember and honour those who sacrificed their lives to secure and protect our freedom.

The event commemorates the contribution of British and Commonwealth military and civilian servicemen and women in the two World Wars, later conflicts such as the Falklands War, the Gulf War, and other conflicts such as those in Afghanistan and Iraq.

On Sunday 10 November, Shavington-cum-Gresty will remember those who lost their lives in war with a commemorative service held in partnership with St Mark's Church, Shavington Methodist Church and Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council.

Following the success of last year, the Service will be once again live streamed and open to public.

The service will start at 10.30am outside Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall. More information to come closer in time.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council Secures Community Access to Shavington Primary School Car Park

Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council is delighted to inform residents that a new five-year sponsorship agreement has been secured with Shavington Primary School. This agreement will ensure that the school's car park on Main Road remains available for community use 24 hours a day, seven days a week, throughout the year.

This agreement, which takes effect on 1 September 2024 and runs until August 2029, allows the Parish Council to continue offering this essential facility to our residents. With an initial annual contribution of £4,500, the Council has successfully preserved a vital community resource that has been accessible for over 30 years.

Councillor Benjamin Gibbs, Chairman of the Parish Council, expressed his satisfaction with the agreement, stating, "We are really pleased to have secured this arrangement for another five years. The car park is an important asset for the community, and it was crucial for us to ensure its availability. We are particularly grateful to Ms Joanna Young, Headteacher at Shavington Primary School, for her support and cooperation throughout the negotiation process. We also want to thank all the staff at The Learning Partnership for their commitment to reaching an outcome that benefits everyone."

This agreement highlights the strong partnership between the Parish Council and Shavington Primary School, reflecting our shared commitment to enhancing community life in Shavington-cum-Gresty. The Council is dedicated to ensuring that local amenities continue to serve the needs of our residents, and this car park is just one example of our efforts to maintain and improve our community facilities.

Residents are encouraged to continue using the car park, knowing that it will remain available for the foreseeable future. As always, the Parish Council is here to support the community and ensure that Shavington-cum-Gresty remains a great place to live, work, and visit.

D DAY 80 ANNIVERSARY EVENTS

Shavington-cum-Gresty prides itself on fostering community spirit and engagement. This year, the Parish Council aimed to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings with a series of events and activities open to all community members. By doing so, a significant historical event was honoured and the commitment to building a united and vibrant community was reinforced.

Starting Strong

Supported by a £3,900 grant from Cheshire East Council and an extra £2,500 allocated from the Parish Council, the D-Day program began with help from local historian Mark Potts, local artists, video makers, and creative writers. These funds were crucial in ensuring events and workshop programs were engaging and inclusive for everyone.



Community Outreach

The Parish Council teamed up with Shavington Academy to create an exclusive interview with D-Day veteran Sergeant Bernard Morgan. This interview, shared on social media, garnered over 4,000 views, effectively connecting the community to history. Additionally, students worked with a creative writer to craft a commemorative poem, which was read at the International D-Day 80th Anniversary Beacon Lighting ceremony held on 6 June 2024.

Creative writing workshops were also offered at Shavington Primary School, leading to Year 5 pupils writing poems for the Beacon Lighting ceremony. Additionally, a series of art workshops produced banners commemorating D-Day, involving young residents in a meaningful way.





D-Day Exhibition

A major highlight was the two-day exhibition curated by local historian Mark Potts. Featuring documents, photos, and artifacts from WWI and WWII, it showcased stories of local residents who served in the wars. Talks by Mark and a children's trail enriched the experience for 400 visitors.

Additionally, the Council funded and distributed a booklet about local hero Richard Pryce Hughes, written by Potts. Every household and school pupil received a copy, keeping his story alive.



Beacon Lighting Event

On 6 June 2024, over 300 residents attended the International D-Day 80th Anniversary Beacon Lighting ceremony in Shavington-cum-Gresty. This event symbolised our community's commitment to remembering D-Day. A poignant moment was when the beacon was lit, casting a warm glow that united everyone in a shared sense of history and remembrance. The hard work of our Community Manager, Clerk, councillors, and volunteers made this program a success, demonstrating the power of community spirit.



Conclusion

The Project Shavington-cum-Gresty D-Day program demonstrates the Parish Council's ability to unite the community through history and remembrance. Despite our small size and limited resources, remarkable results were achieved through creativity, collaboration, and commitment. This initiative highlighted the importance of working together—staff, members, and volunteers alike. There is immense gratitude for their passion, support, and determination. Their collective efforts made this program possible and truly special. As the past is honoured, there is a look forward to building an even stronger, more connected community for the future. 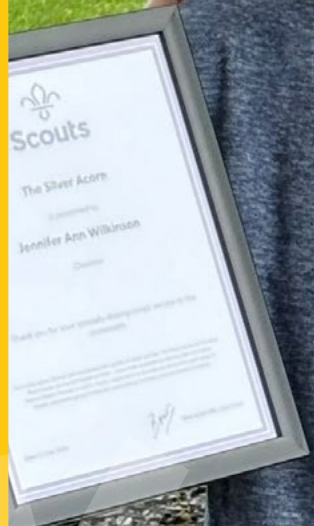
Community Champion

Jen Wilkinson

Jen Wilkinson has just marked an incredible milestone, celebrating 30 years of dedicated service to Scouts in June 2024. Her journey began in 1994 when she took on the role of a leader in the Cub Scouts section in Shavington known as the 12th South West Cheshire (SWC). Since 2006, Jen has been serving as the Group Lead Volunteer (Group Scout Leader) at the 12th SWC, demonstrating unwavering commitment and leadership.

Jen's involvement with the Scouts extends beyond her local group. She has been the Chair of the District Appointments Advisory Committee since 2015. In this role, Jen ensures the committee is well-staffed, organises meetings, and oversees the interview process for new volunteers. Her efforts are vital in making sure that all new Scout leaders in South West Cheshire are thoroughly vetted and well-prepared for their roles.

Additionally, Jen serves as a District Nights Away Assessor. As part of a specialized team, she helps ensure that volunteers who wish to lead camps and other overnight activities possess the necessary skills and knowledge. Her role is crucial in maintaining the safety and quality of these events, ensuring that Scouts have enriching and secure experiences.



Jen also contributes at the County level as a Training Advisor, assisting volunteers in South West Cheshire to complete and validate their training modules to earn their Wood Badge. Her guidance and support are instrumental in the development of skilled and confident Scout leaders.

On 1st May 2024, she was awarded the prestigious Silver Acorn, which, according to the Scouts website, is "Awarded after at least 20 years' service, which should be specially distinguished and appreciably better than outstanding." Following the success of the #QueenBee community project run by the Parish Council in 2022 and conscious of the community appetite to improve and enhance green spaces in the parish, Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council successfully secured National Lottery Community funding of £10,000 for the project 'IMPACT - every leaf counts'.

With 'IMPACT - every leaf counts', the Parish Council aimed to create and enhance the biodiversity in the area with an emphasis on improving pollinator habitats, and to raise awareness and empower residents to take ownership of green spaces in the parish.

The project set out with aims to:

- **Leaf 1:** Revamp existing green spaces with pollinator-friendly plants.
- **Leaf 2:** Convert disused phone kiosks into community vertical herb gardens.
- **Leaf 3:** Establish a group of volunteers to look after green areas in the parish.
- **Leaf 4:** Cultivate environmental awareness with a series of garden coffee meetings.
- **Leaf 5:** Promote opportunities for people to meet and connect with others who share similar interests or values, to help build social networks and strengthen relationships within the community.



Concluding the project, the phone boxes were officially opened and are available for any community members to take a cutting of herbs. Shavington Primary Children involved in the mosaic design met with Parish Council members and the groundsman to look at the finished phone boxes.

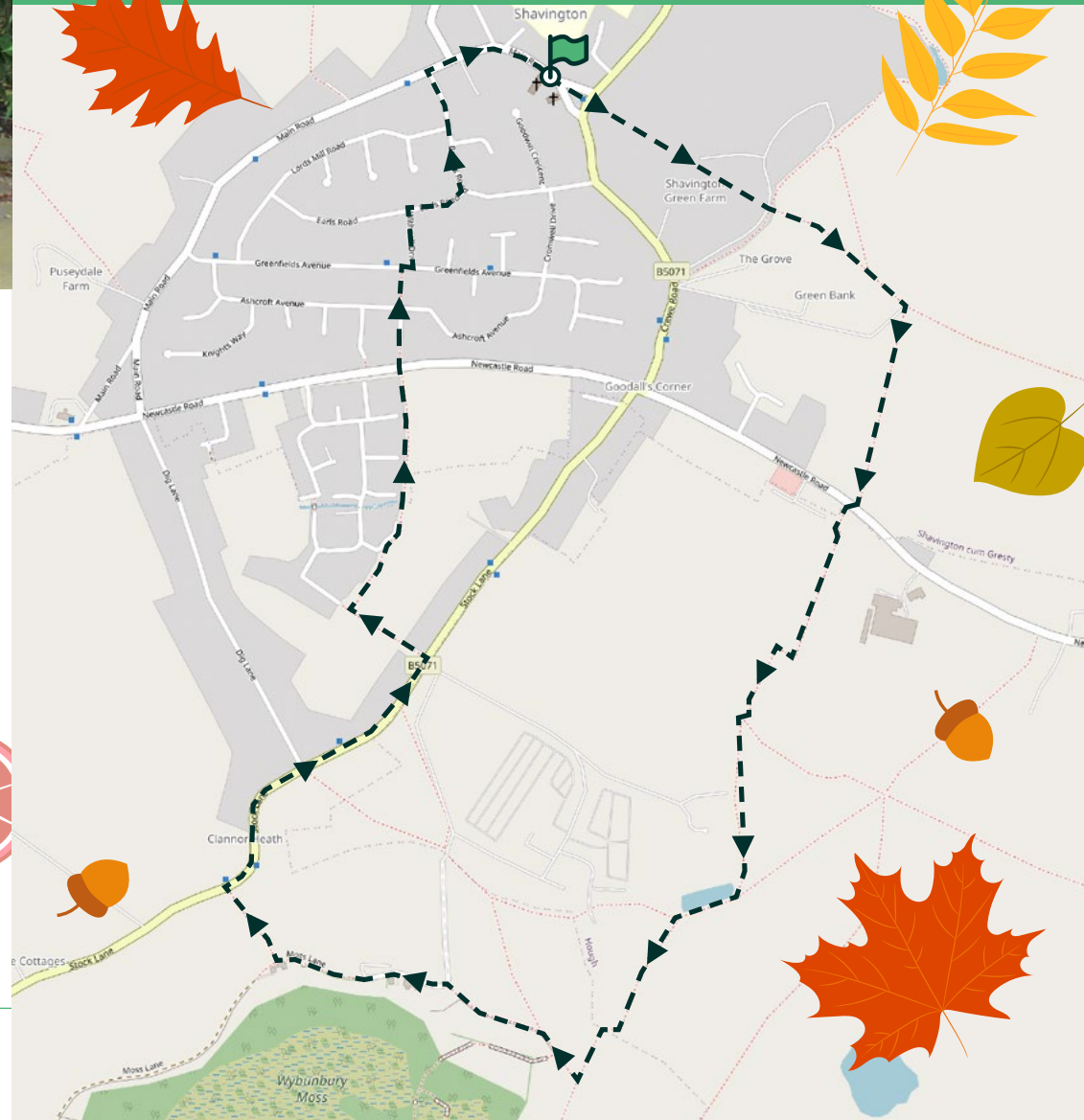
Summer Walk

Spotlight on... St Luke's Support Group

A small number of people back in 1983 saw the need for a hospice and a committee was formed headed by Harold Hassall and Jim Littlemore, Mabel Parker who lived in Shavington was a friend of Harold Hassall and that is how our support group for St Luke's was born.

Between 1983 and 1988 when the hospice was formally opened by Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales on the 18th May, a charity was formed, and so were various support groups in villages and towns. These included support groups in Audlem, Nantwich, Crewe, Sandbach, Holmes Chapel and also included our very own Shavington Support Group which holds monthly events in our village on the third Thursday of every month except December, commencing 7.30pm in St Mark's Church Hall.

Mabel Parker formed a small committee here in Shavington and became Chairperson. She was followed by Irene Webb. I became involved with the committee when asked to open one of their annual garden parties which, sadly, are no longer held. Following Irene, Shirley Bailey has been our chairperson for many years only retiring this year and passing the honour to me.



Not only do we have monthly events, but some of our ladies go out to Hankelow and Haslington to man stalls at their various village events. We always have a stall at our own Village Festival, and I am grateful to the ladies who man those stalls.

In recent months one of our committee, Enid Robinson, has been handed jewellery which is broken or in need of repair. She has taken jewellery of any value and sold it to a jeweller, whilst other jewellery has had the clasps or chains repaired and was then sold on our stalls. This has all added to the funds we, as a support group, have contributed to the hospice.

Last year, from all the events and donations we received, we sent £9,172.94 to the hospice. This is an incredible achievement and I thank all the committee members for their help, and the people who attend all of our events.
