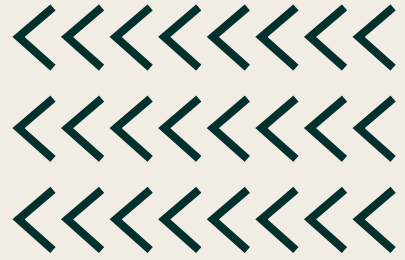

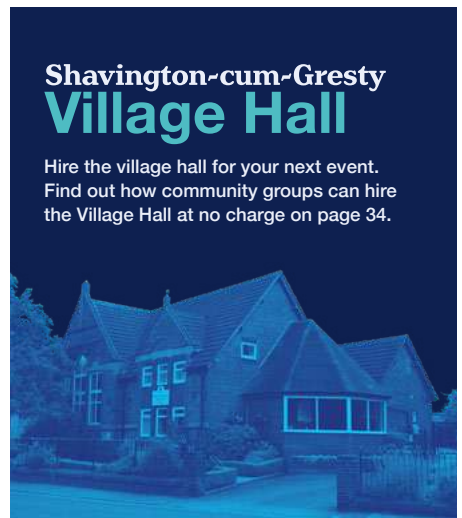

The Parish Council meets regularly each month to discuss matters of importance in the parish. Under delegated power, the committees meet to receive and consider updates and requests that fall under their jurisdiction. They focus on the specific actions in the terms of reference for each of the committees.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council

Community Engagement Committee

Wellbeing Wednesday: The Parish Council received a second grant of £4,900 from the Cheshire East Flourish fund for Wednesday activities:

- Free cardio sessions at the Village Hall every Wednesday morning.
- Community event at the Village Hall every third Wednesday.

150 Years of Education Event:

A series of commemorative events were organised by the Parish Council and Shavington Primary School. Events included:

- Schooling in Shavington-cum-Gresty exhibition.
- Art workshop with Shavington Primary School.
- 150 Years film Interview with former and current staff and students of Shavington Primary and Shavington Academy.
- Open House with tour of Old School

The exhibition event was attended by over 400 residents.

Shavington Village Festival: The Parish Council's stall featured activities, surveys, and free plants, making the event a great success.

Heritage Group: The group continues to be supported with planned events and meetings.

Newsletter: The September newsletter has been distributed, and the December edition is in progress.

Victory in Japan 80th Anniversary 'VJ80': An additional piece of art work was added outside the Village Hall and the Chair of the Parish Council laid a wreath in commemoration of this event.

Finance & Strategy Committee

Budget setting: The finance and strategy committee has begun the process of budget setting for 26/27, considering projects and spending for the year ahead. Each Committee will be able to assess their own budgets, with final approval at the December Parish Council meeting.

Medium-term financial plan: Alongside the budget setting, the finance and strategy committee has also approved a draft medium-term financial plan which will work alongside the 2024-2029 Strategic Plan to help the Council fulfil its strategic aims.

Environment & Recreation Committee

Allotments: The allotment holders continue to meet with the Council regularly and the growing season is in full swing. All our plots

are currently filled. If you would like to be added to the waiting list, please contact clerk@shavingtononline.co.uk

Grounds maintenance: Our grounds contractor reports to the Council regularly. The planters in the village have been looking fantastic this year and we thank them for their continued excellence.

Vine Tree play area: The vine tree play area has had some repair works carried out to the roundabout and flooring to improve safety and usability.

Village Hall Committee

Improvements and repairs: The Village Hall has undergone some minor repairs and improvements in recent months, including replacing locks to increase fire safety and security, blind replacement, new 85" screen to enhance exhibitions (this was utilised at our 150 years of education event and is available for hire).

Longer term improvements: As part of our Sustainability Review, which aims to ensure that the Village Hall is kept up to date and fits our users needs, the committee have commented on priority longer term projects to make larger improvements to the Village Hall over the term of our strategy. More updates will be available on this in the coming months.

Update on hiring periods: We have listened to feedback from our users and adjusted the hiring periods in the Village Hall. From September 2025 weekday hiring slots will move to 8.30am-12.30pm, 1.30pm-5.30pm, and 6.30pm-10.30pm. These dates are provisional – please check our village noticeboard or Shavington Online Facebook page to confirm.

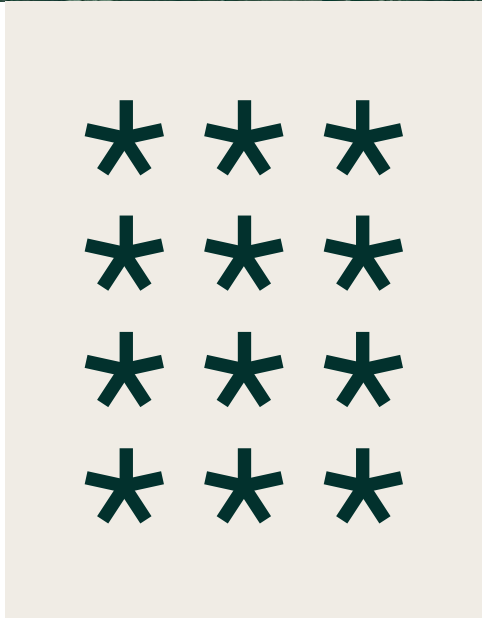
Who can join the Clean Team?

Heritage Book

Compiled by the Shavington Heritage Group and to be published in 2025, 'Shavington cum Gresty - A Step Back in Time' chronicles the village's evolution from Victorian times to the 1980s, through personal stories, photographs, and historical records.

Key highlights include:

- Shavington's growth from a scattered village in 1851 with 453 inhabitants to a thriving community, influenced by railway expansion, world wars, and housing developments.
- Detailed stories of villagers who served in both World Wars, including tributes to fallen soldiers and Peace Day celebrations.
- Accounts of local clubs, sports teams, May Day festivals, and businesses, showcasing the vibrant social fabric of the village.
- Profiles of influential residents, such as George Mottershead, founder of Shavington Zoo, and Alfred Dodd, a renowned poultry breeder.
- Historical insights into buildings like Shavington Hall, local churches, schools, and shops, some of which have been repurposed or demolished over time.

The book traces changes in the village, including housing estates, the rise of supermarkets, and the decline of traditional businesses and serves as a tribute to Shavington's rich heritage, aiming to raise funds for local charities and preserve the village's legacy for future generations.

Tackling Waste Crime




Did you know there is a potential fine of up to £5,000 if illegally dumped waste can be traced back to the owner?

The Waste Crime Partnership is encouraging residents to ask three simple questions whenever a company pops up on sites like Facebook and Next-door, or knocks on their door:

- What is your official company name?
- What is your waste permit number?
- Will you be able to provide a waste transfer note?

Any legitimate business should be able to answer these three simple questions. If they can't then residents shouldn't risk a potential £5,000 fine.

-  **Mail:** Leave a message in the post-box outside the Village Hall for non-urgent matters.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Remembrance Service

9 November 2025

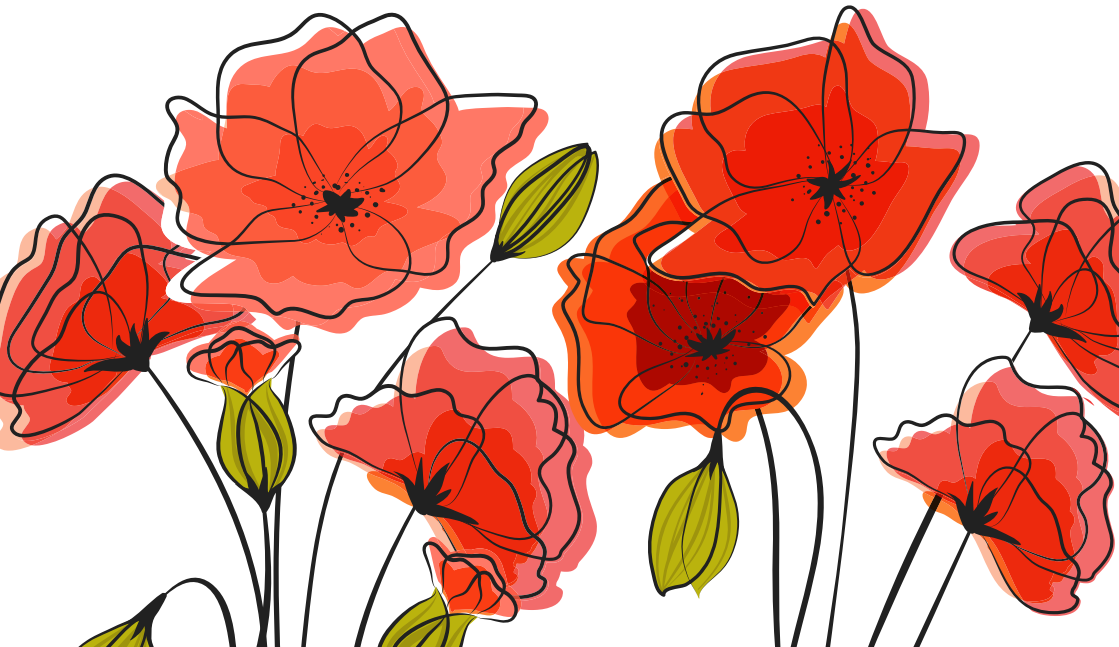
Remembrance Sunday, which this year falls on 9 November, is a day for the whole nation to remember and honour those who sacrificed their lives to secure and protect our freedom.

The event commemorates the contribution of British and Commonwealth military and civilian servicemen and women in the two World Wars, later conflicts such as the Falklands War, the Gulf War, and other conflicts such as those in Afghanistan and Iraq.

On Sunday 9 November, Shavington-cum-Gresty will remember those who lost their lives in war with a commemorative service held in partnership with St Mark's Church, Shavington Methodist Church and Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council.

Following the success of last year, the Service will once again be live streamed and open to the public.

The service will start at 10.30am outside Shavington-cum-Gresty Village Hall. More information to come closer in time.

Years of Education in

Shavington-cum-Gresty

There are few things more powerful than a community coming together to celebrate its shared history—and in July, our Parish did just that. To mark 150 years of education in Shavington-cum-Gresty, the Parish Council, in partnership with Shavington Primary School, organised a weekend of events filled with nostalgia, learning, laughter, and connection.

With families, former teachers, pupils, volunteers, and neighbours from across generations all taking part, the weekend was a heartwarming tribute to our Parish's long-standing dedication to education and community spirit.

School Tour for Former Staff

The weekend began with a very special school tour, welcoming back former teachers and staff members to Shavington Primary School. Led with warmth and enthusiasm by Mrs Young, the current Headteacher, the tour was more than a walk through the building—it was a walk down memory lane.

Many of the former staff members were visibly moved as they stepped back into the familiar corridors, recalling the joyful noise of classrooms, school plays, sports days, and the hundreds of young lives they had helped shape over the years.

Over 400 visitors explored the exhibition, many pausing to point at familiar faces in old class photos or to share stories sparked by long-forgotten items. There were moments of laughter, reflection, and even a few tears as the display stirred memories for so many.

A big thank you goes to Andrea Gibbs for her organisation of the exhibition, Helen Lea and Mark Potts for their assistance with the Parish Council. Also, thanks to the Woodnoth-cum-Shavington Women's Institute, who served refreshments with their signature hospitality—keeping conversations flowing over cups of tea and biscuits.

They pointed out where their classrooms once were and reflected on how the school had grown—particularly the impressive Key Stage 2 extension built in 2020.

One of the most special parts of the visit was the interaction with current pupils. The children were eager to hear stories of 'what school used to be like' and proudly showed off their learning spaces. Conversations sparked across generations, and it was truly moving to see.

The Parish Council extends its thanks to Mrs Young for her care in organising and leading the tour and for making everyone feel so welcome.

Exhibition of Memories: A Glimpse Through the Years

At the heart of the celebration was a remarkable exhibition that brought together photographs, artefacts, and memorabilia from as far back as 1890. The display transformed the Village Hall into a living museum of educational heritage, capturing everything from school uniforms to learning games, handwritten logbooks, class





School Talks

At the exhibition a series of talks took place in the packed Hall, where chairs were filled and extra standing room was needed—proof of the community’s deep affection for the schools and the people within them.

Former Headteacher Tom Weston took the audience on a journey through the evolution of education in Shavington, speaking with great affection about the joys and challenges of teaching and the privilege of leading the school.

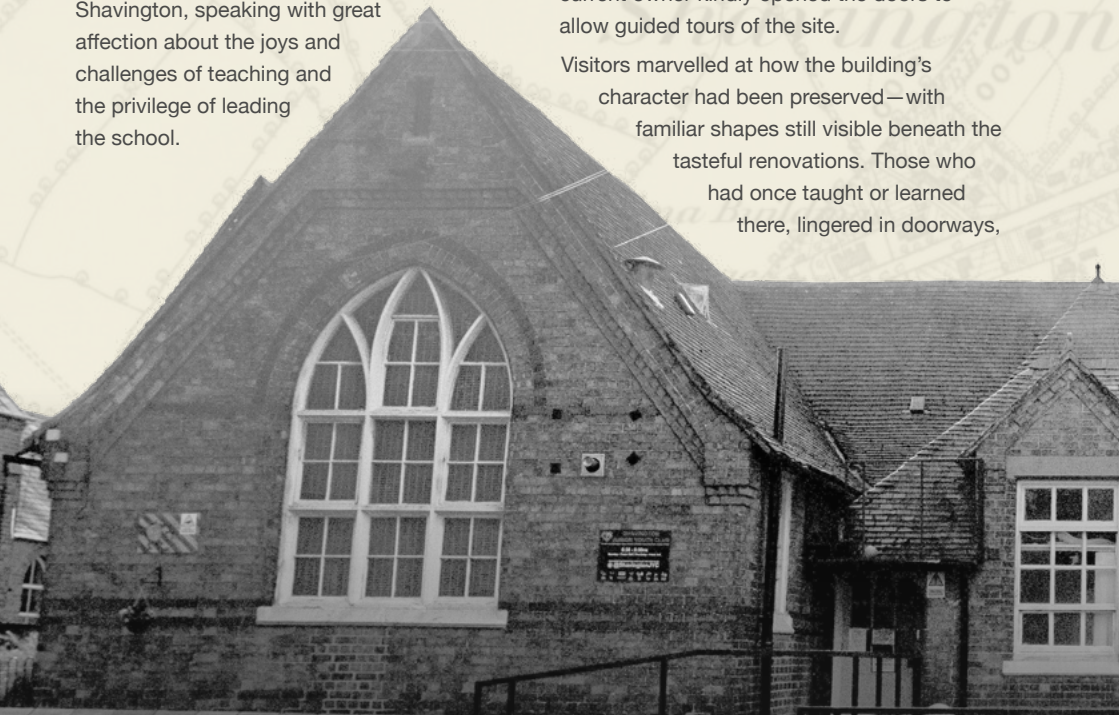
Former teacher Helen Lea shared her memories of classroom life, as well as her dedication to fundraising for the Guide Dog Association—an initiative remembered fondly by many in the room.

Andrea Gibbs, a shining example of our community’s strength, spoke of her own time as a pupil at Shavington Primary, and how it eventually led her to return as Assistant Headteacher. Her stories brought both laughter and quiet reflection as she painted a vivid picture of school life in both the old and new buildings.

Tour of the Old School Building

A highlight of the weekend was the rare and generous opportunity to step inside the original Shavington School building, now beautifully converted into three homes. The current owner kindly opened the doors to allow guided tours of the site.

Visitors marvelled at how the building’s character had been preserved—with familiar shapes still visible beneath the tasteful renovations. Those who had once taught or learned there, lingered in doorways,



quietly recalling moments from their own school days.

The Parish Council is deeply thankful to Steve, the owner for opening their doors and their hearts to help us celebrate this historic milestone.

150 Years of Education Film

To ensure the weekend would live on in memory, a commemorative film was commissioned—one that tells the story of Shavington’s educational journey through the voices of its people.

The film begins at the Old School site, where Mr Astbury, a much-loved former teacher, reflects on his teaching days and the sense of family that filled the school. We follow him to the modern-day Shavington Primary School, where Mrs Young and current pupils share what school life looks like today—full of energy, creativity, and curiosity.

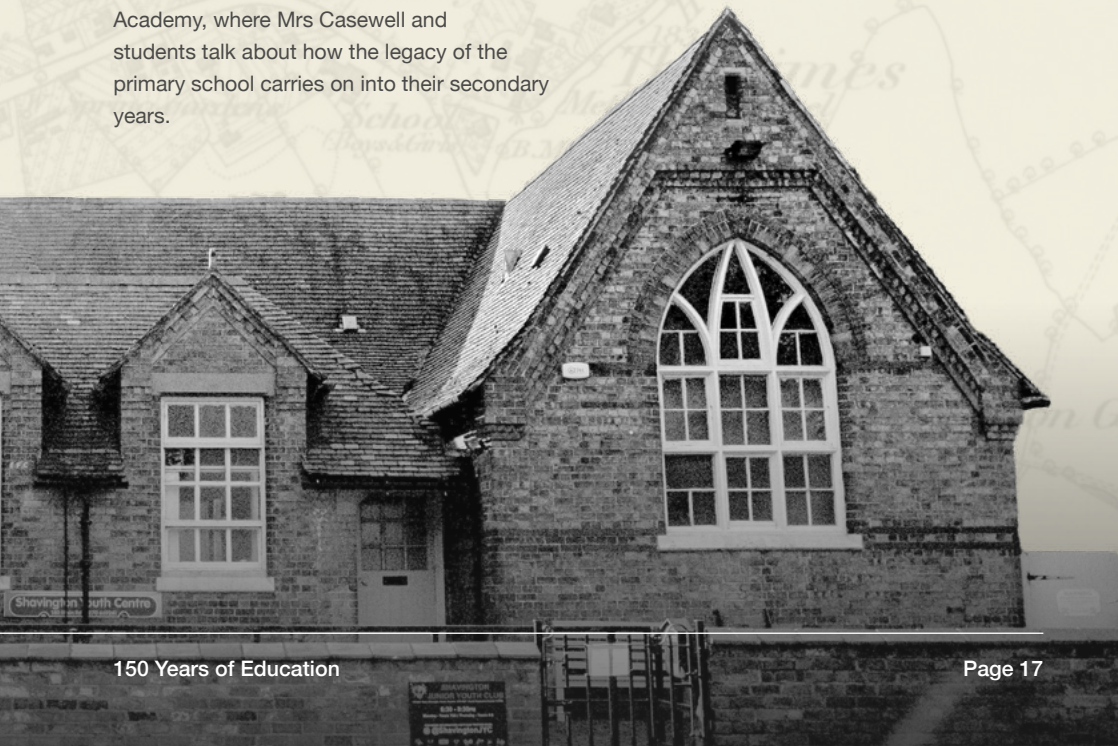
The journey continues to Shavington Academy, where Mrs Casewell and students talk about how the legacy of the primary school carries on into their secondary years.

Produced by the very talented Little Forest Films, and featuring great drone footage by Dave Cage, the film includes a beautiful shot of pupils forming the number “150” on the school field and chanting ‘Shavington’—an image that perfectly captures the unity and pride of our Parish.

Legacy in Artwork

As a lasting tribute to this celebration, pupils from Key Stage 2 have begun work on a special commemorative artwork. They have explored how education has changed over the past 150 years, and their drawings will be part of a larger installation created in collaboration with a local artist this Autumn.

Once complete, the artwork will be proudly displayed to remind future generations of the strength and heart of the Shavington-cum-Gresty community.



Additional Contributions

Among those who contributed to this legacy is Mrs Yvonne Williams, the first Headteacher of the Infant School when it opened in April 1972. Although she was, sadly, unable to attend the commemorations in person, she wanted to share her memories and be part of the celebration for a school that held a very special place in her heart.

She recalled how, when the new Infant School opened, Cheshire Council made the decision to allow all seven-year-olds to join for a term. This allowed the school to begin with a full range of ages before the children returned to the Junior School in September as first-year juniors. Mrs Williams led this new school with a pioneering approach to open-plan learning, supported by Deputy Head Mary Sherratt, and a team that included Muriel Mathews, Shelia Barnett, and Lou Barnett—wife of the then Junior School Head.

As one of only two open-plan infant schools in the county at the time (alongside The Dingle at Haslington), Shavington's new Infant School quickly became a showcase for innovation in early years education. Teachers, Councillors, and education authorities from far and wide came to tour the school—and eventually, older pupils were even trained to lead the tours themselves.

Mrs Williams fondly remembered how some people were unsure about this new teaching style at first, but her team embraced it wholeheartedly—and it proved a great success. She also paid tribute to Councillor Theo Steele, Chair of Governors, whose incredible support, encouragement and pride in the school was, in her words, “a rock” to her as Head.



The school was so popular that two mobile classrooms were added to accommodate demand—clear signs of a thriving and growing school. As the Infant School took on more pupils, numbers at the Junior School declined, and the decision was made to amalgamate both schools. An extension was built in 1986/87, and the two schools finally came together on a single site.

Mr Tom Weston, then Head of the Junior School, became Headteacher of the newly unified Shavington Primary School, with Mrs Pat Griffiths as Deputy Head. Many staff remained and helped build the school into the much-loved hub of our Parish that it remains today—firmly at the heart of community life.

This celebration was made possible through the shared efforts and commitment of our community—from the Parish Council and the school, to families, residents, volunteers, and former staff. Whether you donated a photo, gave a talk, served tea, returned to visit, or simply came to share in the joy—we thank you.

Together, we honoured the past, celebrated the present, and looked forward to the future of education in our Parish.

Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish is proud to shine the spotlight on its Community Manager – Sara Randle. We are delighted to share that Sara, a lifelong Shavington resident, has been named 'Food Educator of the Year' in the 2025 Jamie Oliver Good School Food Awards.

Sara, who is Head of Food at Sir William Stanier School in Crewe, was left speechless and in tears when she was surprised with the national award. The award celebrates her 25 years of dedication to making food education fun, practical, and meaningful for students and families alike.

Celebrity chef Jamie Oliver called Sara *"a total star,"* saying her passion for food education *"changes lives."* He praised the way she brings confidence, curiosity, and connection into the classroom and beyond.

"She's the kind of teacher who changes lives," Jamie said. *"She's shown that good food education isn't just about cooking."*

Sara was nominated by her colleagues, her family, and even local MP, Connor Naismith, who praised her commitment to helping young people build confidence, community, and healthy habits through food.





She has helped create a school culture where food brings people together. Sara led projects to build a rooftop allotment, wildflower meadow, and school pond, giving pupils the chance to grow their own ingredients and learn where food really comes from. She also organises trips to farms, food factories, and hospitality venues to give students a taste of real-world food careers.

Her classroom doesn't end at her own school – she also welcomes local primary school pupils to learn how to cook, and runs after-

school clubs where children and their families cook together. She makes sure no one misses out, often covering the cost of ingredients or trips herself.

Sara has also helped students cook meals for local homeless groups, organised charity bake sales, and shown how food can bring joy, purpose, and kindness into the wider community.

Sara grew up in Shavington, attending both the primary and secondary schools here and now settled with her husband Shaun and their two girls. Today, alongside her teaching, she also works part-time as the Community Manager for the Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council.

In this role, she organises many important events and activities for the village, including; Remembrance Service, Carols at Christmas, D-Day 80 and VE Day 80 commemorations, Supporting the Clean Team and Running local programmes such as Wellbeing Wednesday, #QueenBee, and IMPACT

She always brings people together and helps everyone feel included.

As well as being a member of Friends of Shavington Primary School, Sara is also the Children and Families Worker at St Mark's Church. She organises toddler and children's groups, creates beautiful displays outside the church, and plans the much-loved Advent Window Trail each Christmas. Her work brings joy to many local families and helps strengthen the sense of community in the village.

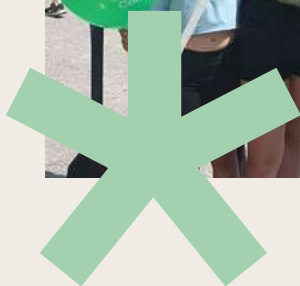
Shavington Village Festival
