9. Scout Hut	12 th South West Scouts	Name of scout group
10. Alma Buildings	Around 10–15 years	Built shortly after the Battle of Alma (1854).
11. Marina Terrace	16	Number of chimney stacks
12. Former ABP Shop	2	Number of windows
13. Goodall Corner	GR – King George V	Post box
14. Alfred Potts Way	Way	Road type.
15. Roundabouts Nursery	11	Number of children on the sign
16. TOC H / Providence Chapel	1909	Year on foundation stone
17. Wesley Terrace	12	Number of houses
18. St Mark's Church	10	Number of Gothic-style windows
19. Sugarloaf Corner	87	Number of sugarloaf cottage
20. Milestone	Audlem 8 ½ miles	Furthest destination shown
21. Swill Brook	Avenue	Brook Avenue is an Avenue.
22. Shavington Social Club	Red	Colour of the original mill bricks (confirm on site).
23. Dodd's Bank	Hens	Black Minorca hens.
24. Shavington Primary School	Squirrel	Animal on the school crest.
25. Osborne Grove	Bag Street	Original road nickname.
26. The Vine	Grape Vine	Climbing plant on the pub sign.
27. Shavington Villa	French	Alfred de Vigny was French.
28. Queen Street	None	Queen Street is the only road called a "Street" in Shavington-cum-Gresty.
