

## 1. Shavington Village Hall

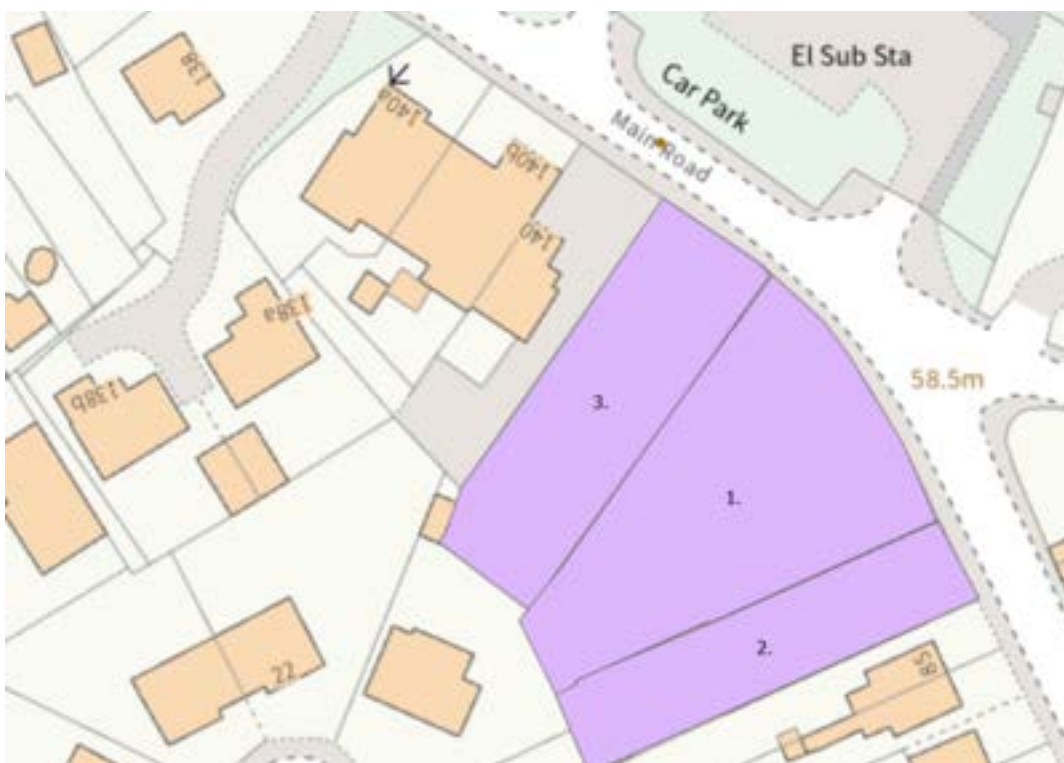


### 3. Methodist Church

## 6. SOLT (formerly the Elephant Pub)

SOLT, the former Elephant Public House, is located on Newcastle Road and historically provided a public house and social meeting place for residents of Shavington and the surrounding area. Although currently operating as a restaurant, the site continues to have a role in supporting local social interaction and community life, providing a place for residents to meet and socialise. Its location on Newcastle Road and its established



presence within the village mean that the site forms part of Shavington's local built character and community history. The former pub therefore has value as a reminder of the village's traditional community facilities and social infrastructure.

## 7. Hickory's Smokehouse (formerly the Cheshire Cheese Pub)

Hickory's Smokehouse, formerly the Cheshire Cheese public house, is located on Crewe Road and provides a restaurant and social venue serving Shavington and the surrounding area. The site has a longstanding association with hospitality and social activity, having previously operated as a traditional public house before being redeveloped as a smokehouse restaurant. Its role as a place for people to eat, meet and socialise contributes to the range of leisure and hospitality facilities available locally. The continued use of the site for hospitality also maintains an established community function and contributes to the village's sense of place and local identity.

## 8. The Vine Pub

As an established local childcare facility, it contributes to the wellbeing and day-to-day needs of the community and provides an important service for families with young children. Its presence also supports the village's ability to accommodate a range of age groups and contributes to Shavington's role as a sustainable and inclusive community.

The store also contributes to the vitality of the local area by providing a regular point of activity and informal interaction between residents. Its convenient location and role in meeting everyday



needs make it a valuable local service, particularly for residents who may have limited access to private transport.
